At its March 21, 2011 meeting, the Board unanimously approved the `Aiea CBDO's participation in Empower O`ahu's application to the Administration for Native Americans for the Developing Communities Project, for the period September 2011 to September 2014.

Claire J. Tamamoto, President of the `Aiea CBDO is authorized to sign documents and negotiate on behalf of the `Aiea CBDO.


