RED HILL UNDERGROUND FUEL TANKS TO BE SHUT DOWN

In a statement released on March 7, 2022, Secretary of Defense Lloyd J. Austin, III, has stated that he will permanently shut down the Red Hill Underground Fuel Tanks. The Secretary of the Navy and Director of the Defense Logistics Agency will provide an action plan no later than May 31, 2022, to shut down the Red Hill Fuel Tanks within 12 months.

Corrective actions will be taken to that defueling will be safe, and then defueling will commence. After defueling has been completed, the closure of the Red Hill facility will commence, including any needed environmental remediation around the facility.

The Navy and Department of Defense Logistics Agency will be working with the Hawaii Department of Health and Environmental Protection Agency to ensure that the Red Hill Fuel Tanks are defueled and closed safely.

THE CAPITOL IS NOW OPEN TO THE PUBLIC

The State Capitol is open to the public once again. Building hours are from 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday. There are some restrictions:

- Masks are required when visiting the State Capitol
- Upon entry, you must present a photo ID and either proof of vaccination or negative COVID-19 test taken within 72 hours of entry into the building
- Parking at the Capitol is limited to authorized personnel. Public parking is available at: Lot V (Vineyard Garage on Punchbowl); Lot G (Kalanimoku Building on Beretania and Punchbowl) and Lot L (Kinau Hale Building on Punchbowl)
