Resolution 22-173 Performance Audit of Department of Planning and Permitting

This summer I introduced Resolution 22-173, which requests the Honolulu City Auditor to conduct a performance audit of the Department of Planning and Permitting's (DPP) selection of employees for temporary assignment in the last ten years. I introduced this legislation to address concerns regarding selecting employees for temporary assignment. The performance audit would provide actionable recommendations to the DPP. The Resolution will be heard in the Zoning and Planning Committee on August 25.

Get Your Passport At Ala Moana Satellite City Hall

In response to increasing demand for international travel, the Ala Moana Satellite City Hall began accepting U.S. passport applications this month on an appointment-only basis. There are 32 passport application appointments available each day, and online appointments for a passport application can be booked at <u>www.AlohaQ.org</u>.

Applications will not be accepted without all required documentation, which includes proof of citizenship, government ID, and a check or money order for the passport fee. For more information, visit <u>honolulu.gov/csd</u>.

Real Property Tax Homeowners Exemptions Are Due on September 30

Homeowners who live on their property are encouraged to file a claim for a home exemption to reduce their real property assessments and taxes by the September 30, 2022 deadline.

Eligible homeowners must own and occupy their property as the principal home. If the taxpayer files an application by September 30, 2022, the exemption begins on the tax year starting on July 1, 2023. You would only need to file this exemption once.

For qualifying homeowners under 65 years of age, the exemption amount is \$100,000. For those 65 years and older, the exemption amount is \$140,000.

A change in ownership or use voids the exemption and must be reported to the City Real Property Assessment Division within 30 days of the transaction. Failure to notify the City will subject the claimant to back taxes and a penalty for each year that the change remains unreported.
