

COUNCIL DISTRICT 7

Our new Council District begins at intersection of Waimalu Stream and H-1 Freeway and runs:



- 1. Southeasterly along said freeway to Kalauao Stream;
- 2. Northeasterly along said stream to unnamed intersecting ridge line;
- 3. Easterly along said ridge to Ko'olau Ridge;
- 4. Southeasterly along said ridge to eastern boundary of Fort Shafter Military Reservation;
- 5. Southwesterly along said boundary to unnamed boundary along Wilson Road;
- 6. Southeasterly along said boundary to Middle Street;
- 7. Southwesterly along said street to H-1 Freeway;
- 8. Southeasterly along said freeway to Kapālama Canal;
- 9. Southwesterly along said canal to O'ahu shoreline;
- 10. Westerly along said shoreline to Waimalu Stream;
- 11. Northerly along said stream to point of beginning.

CITY TO BEGIN ISSUING 4-YEAR LICENSES TO DRIVERS AGE 72 AND OLDER





O'ahu residents who are between ages 72 and 79 will have the option to renew their driver's license every four years, starting Tuesday Jan. 3. The new service gives the more than 75,000 drivers in this age group long-awaited additional time to update expiring licenses.

State law enacted last year made it possible for the City and County of Honolulu to offer 4-year driver's licenses - instead of only 2-year driver's licenses - to residents in this particular age group who are free of conditions that could impair their driving ability.

All driver's licenses can be renewed up to six months prior to expiration. The four-year driver's license renewal fee is \$20, which is consistent with the current \$5 per year fee for driver's licenses. Drivers age 72 and older with conditions that could impair their driving ability remain eligible for a two-year driver's license, and are required to submit a Medical Report, Form DOT-H2058.
