MAKALAPA NEIGHBORHOOD PARK WORKING GROUP YOUTH ENGAGEMENT: WORKING TOWARDS A DESIGN WORKSHOP

In May 2022, the National Park Service (NPS) Rivers, Trails, and Conservation Assistance Program selected Makalapa Neighborhood Park as one of 30 new projects nationwide to receive technical assistance in developing a plan to activate and revitalize the park. The goal of this one-year project is to develop a plan and strategy to beautify the park, create walking and biking paths between the park and the surrounding area, including to anticipated future Transit-Oriented Development projects, increase pride in the Makalapa Community, and enhance a sense of ownership of the park. To facilitate the planning process, the NPS and community and governmental partners have formed the Makalapa Working Group.

The working group is currently partnering with Parents and Children Together (PACT) to get input from youth in Makalapa as to their vision of what the park should look like; and will be hosting a design workshop this spring. The workshop will include four designs using different mediums, which include a foliage planting plan, ways to cool down the park, and overall recommendations for the park.

In order to prepare the youth for this workshop, a series of pre-workshop sessions, beginning last December and continuing through March, will be provided to school-age participants. These sessions, which include field trips to various locations around the island, are designed to guide an appreciation of a landscape from what can be seen and experienced today to the geological and cultural history of the site—how this landscape came to be and how people before us interacted with the land—and then to re-imagine the space as a focal point for the community.

A community design charrette is anticipated to be held this summer, and the date will be announced as soon as it is scheduled.

O'AHU HISTORIC PRESERVATION COMMISSION SEEKING CANDIDATES

All members should also have demonstrated interest, competence, and knowledge in historic preservation.
