


Navy Region Hawaii

Key Updates:

- Joint Task Force Red Hill (JTF-RH) and Navy Closure Task Force Red Hill (NCTF-RH) hosted a transition Open House Feb. 7 at Ke'ehi Lagoon Memorial Park, to share information about residual fuel removal and the transition from JTF-RH to NCTF-RH. As of Feb. 12, JTF-RH removed approximately 29,273 gallons of residual fuel from the Red Hill Bulk Fuel Storage Facility's pipelines.
- Navy Closure Task Force Red Hill (NCTF-RH) launched its new website at <u>www.navyclosuretaskforce.navy.mil</u>. The website hosts information about the new command. The NCTF-RH and JTF-RH also held a combined open house on yesterday to explain the closure mission and tank cleaning of the RHBFSF.
- The Interagency Drinking Water System Team developed a long-term plan to monitor drinking water quality. Long term monitoring results are posted on the Joint Base Pearl Harbor-Hickam Safe Waters website. The Department of Navy is surging personnel, resources, and expertise to respond to reports raising concerns about the quality of water from the Navy's water system. The water meets Federal and State safe drinking water standards. The Navy's priority is providing reliable and safe drinking water to those who live and work on the Navy's water system. The Navy is also responding to their concerns.
