

Project Update



The NASED Project continues forth, albeit with one priority-listed offeror as Waiola Development Partners (WDP) decided to withdraw from the project's procurement






process. This leaves Aloha Halawa District Partners (AHDP) as the sole remaining priority-listed offeror, which does not impact the procurement or project timelines.

- The proposal deadline will remain as stipulated in the RFP: July 31, 2024.
- The state will continue the process to confirm selection of a preferred offeror in September 2024.
- The state and the preferred offeror will then finalize technical and other matters and sign the relevant agreements by June 2025.
- The state is still planning for the stadium opening in summer 2028.

We will continue our collaborative dialogue with AHDP over the coming weeks and very much look forward to receiving its proposal by July 31. We also thank WDP and its team members for their participation in the procurement process and wish them the best in their future endeavors.



FAQs


Q: How will the state ensure value for money with only one offeror?

A: NASED is being procured via a "progressive" procurement approach. This means that the state will select a single preferred offeror based on the best proposal and then, over the following nine (9) months' diligence and discussion phase, resolve a range of technical and other matters and negotiate and sign the relevant agreements.

A progressive procurement was selected given the complexity of NASED and the broad range of issues that the state is only able to resolve with a prospective developer. This approach allows the state to transfer more risk to the developer than if we required fixed prices in the proposals submitted in July.

In addition, proposals (due in July) are required to include <u>commitments</u> to certain elements of the NASED project (e.g., stadium quality and scope). These commitments will need to be maintained by the preferred offeror through the diligence and discussion phase. If a commitment is broken, the state can open negotiation on other commercial terms or cancel the process.





The RFP and the diligence and discussion phase clearly define the standards to be met (i) before a preferred offeror is selected, and (ii) before agreements are awarded and signed. These standards reflect value for money for the state. The withdrawal of one priority-listed offeror does not alter these standards. If anything, it drives that the state be even more vigilant to ensure these standards are met.

Q: Is Aloha Halawa District Partners still required to submit a Proposal?

A: The NASED procurement process remains as delineated and will proceed as envisioned. Aloha Halawa District Partners is required to submit a compliant proposal by July 31, 2024, to be considered for selection as preferred offeror.

Aloha Halawa District Partners' proposal will be evaluated against the evaluation criteria by the state's established evaluation committee, supported by technical advisors to the committee. The proposal will be required to meet certain thresholds for Aloha Halawa District Partners to be selected as the preferred offeror.

Ultimately, Aloha Halawa District Partners' proposal will have to demonstrate acceptable value for money to the state of Hawai'i. If the proposal fails to demonstrate acceptable value for money, the state has the right to terminate the procurement process and not award the project to any offeror.



This Month in History



The Annual EK Fernandez 50th State Fair showcased X-Factor's up and coming stars Fifth Harmony.


