Operating in District 32, The Pantry is Hawai'i's only e-commerce food pantry that operates year-round to provide free, nutritious food to local families. Representative Shimizu joined Representative Iwamoto for a tour of the facility.



HAWAII FOOD BANK

Every 2nd Saturday in May is the National Association of Letter Carriers' (NALC) "Stamp Out Hunger National Food Drive." It is the largest one-day food drive in the nation. Representative Shimizu and his wife joined fellow Kinaole Lions club members and many other volunteers in assisting the Hawai'i Food Bank by sorting and packing donated canned goods and food items that day.



HIKING WITH THE NEWLY FORMED MOANALUA-KALIHI-KAPALAMA-NUUANU WATERSHED COLLABORATION

At the invitation of Moanalua Gardens Foundation, Representative Shimizu hiked Moanalua Valley Trail to learn more about the trail. Also known as the Middle Ridge trail, Moanalua Valley Trail is the start of the Kamananui Valley Road Trail and eventually leads to the Kulana'ahane Trail at the top of the Ko'olau mountains. The trail was closed last year due to the removal of Hā'ikū Stairs.

RED HILL VISIT

Alongside fellow Legislators, Representative Shimizu visited the Red Hill Fuel Facility for a visual tour. The Federal government's decision to decommission the tanks has largely progressed with all fuel drained, cleaning of tank interiors are in progress and ahead of schedule, and piping removal will start sometime this 3rd quarter. Tracking, monitoring, and resolving previously spilled fuel that has entered our aquifer continues to be a main concern. It is important to continue holding the Federal government accountable in addressing them.
