
Meeting With Councilmember Cordero

In response to community concerns about large commercial vehicles parking too close to intersections in Foster Village, Representative Garner Shimizu met with Councilmember Radiant Cordero to explore possible safety improvements. Representative Shimizu suggested increasing the minimum parking distance from intersections to improve visibility and reduce potential hazards for drivers. Our office will continue working with City officials and the Department of Transportation Services to assess solutions and keep neighborhood streets safe for all residents.



Standing in Unity with Kamehameha Schools

Representative Shimizu stands in solidarity with Kamehameha Schools and the Native Hawaiian community as they face a new legal challenge to the school's admissions policy. He recognizes the deep cultural and historical significance of Ke Ali'i Pauahi's legacy, which has provided generations of Native Hawaiian students with access to education and opportunity. Kamehameha Schools has pledged to vigorously defend Ke Ali'i Pauahi's kauoha and remain steadfast in its mission to uplift Native Hawaiian learners and strengthen the future of Hawai'i's people.

The program explored some recent cases and developments affecting society, including guidance on pastoral endorsements, equal access for religious organizations in public schools, and child custody protection. Site Visit to Hālawa Correctional Facility

As part of the Restrictive Housing Working Group, Representative Shimizu participated in a site visit to Hālawa Correctional Facility to gain firsthand insight into current housing conditions and rehabilitation efforts. The visit provided an important opportunity to engage with the Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation Director Johnson and staff, and discuss ongoing efforts to improve safety, transparency, and outcomes within Hawai'i's correctional system.

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Additional Events

'Aiea Monitoring Wells Community Meeting

Representative Shimizu attended the Board of Water Supply presentation of their plan for two new monitoring wells located within the 'Aiea Field annex. In response to the Red Hill Fuel spills, these wells will help monitor groundwater quality and safeguard our water supply. Construction is anticipated to begin in the last quarter of 2026 with an expected duration of four months for each well. The construction process was explained to neighbors, and questions and concerns were addressed.

Elections Commission Meetings

Attendance and testimony at these monthly meetings have become a priority, to monitor the ongoing discussion and appropriate review of public voting concerns. Transparency and accountability in our elections is crucial to our democratic process, helping to build public confidence and increase voter participation. Representative Shimizu is committed to ensuring and strengthening election integrity through open dialogue and continued legislative oversight.

Moanalua Middle School Food Trucks

Community spirit was on full display at Moanalua Middle School's Food Truck Event, where families, students, and staff came together for an evening of food, fun, and fellowship. Representative Shimizu joined in the celebration, enjoying the local flavors and connecting with parents and educators about the importance of supporting school programs that bring the community together. Events like these highlight the strong partnerships that make Moanalua a vibrant and thriving district.

Public Safety Informational Briefing

Representative Shimizu attended the recent House Committee on Public Safety informational briefing focused on exploring best practices for medical release programs within correctional systems across the United States. The discussion, featuring presentations by Molly Crane of Families for Justice Reform and Christin M. Johnson of the Hawai'i Correctional System Oversight Commission, examined how these models can inform and introduce policies to balance compassion, accountability, and public safety in Hawaiʻi's correctional facilities.

Menehune Classic Marching Band Festival

Music and school pride filled the air at the Menehune Classic Marching Band Festival, where talented students from across the island showcased their hard work and dedication. Representative Shimizu joined families, faculty, and community members in celebrating the outstanding performances and spirit of Hawai'i's young musicians. He commended the students and organizers for their commitment to excellence, teamwork, and keeping the tradition of marching band alive in our schools.

Moanalua Community Fall Fest

Moanalua Gardens Missionary Church's annual event provided families and the community a great venue to enjoy food trucks, games, rides, and entertainment for a fun-filled evening of connection and aloha.
