- IX. Moanalua Building: 99-230 Moanalua Road, Permitted for trenching. Raised questions at ANB for them to elaborate on the trenching work . . .how long with the modified sidewalk and bus stop.

“The project is delayed due to a number of issues including subcontractor problems, meeting BWS requirements, scheduling etc. The trench has been open for an extended period of time, which is unacceptable. The contractor is informed to cover the open trench area immediately for safety concerns by the end of day. This can be temporary cover using steel plates, plywood, or asphalt patch, until the work can resume and the trench permanently restored.

Overnight closure of roads and sidewalks are permitted/administered by the Department of Transportation Services. DTS confirmed yesterday that the subject project no longer has a Street Use Permit. They aware of concerns and public complaint at this location, which they previously investigated.

DPP Civil Engineering Branch is assisting with enforcement by reiterating, to the contractor, the need to restore safe conditions and that the current sidewalk/road closure is unpermitted. We will further assist by escalating to HPD this week if we do not see action to safely cover the trenched area.”
